

# Weekly Speech Practice at Home

<b>Weeks 1-2</b>	Look through a magazine and cut out 5-10 words with your speech sound. Glue them to make a collage or a vocabulary book.	Look through your favorite storybook finding all of the words with your speech sound.	Go on a nature walk or a walk around the block and find 5 things with your speech sound.	Draw a picture showing 3 things with your speech sound.	Sing to the tune of your favorite song replacing all of the words with your speech sound plus a vowel (e.g. rah, rah, rah... or see, see, see...).
<b>Weeks 3-4</b>	Play a guessing game where you guess words with your speech sound after being given several clues ("I'm thinking of something that...").	Describe your favorite cartoon character or super hero using 5 describing words with your speech sound.	Play a Bingo game with words with your speech sound. When you reach Bingo, say each word in that column or row 3 times.	Find 5 canned items in your pantry that have your speech sound and say each word 3 times.	Say words with your speech sound as many times as you can bounce a ball or a balloon, or juggle, or hula hoop at one time.
<b>Weeks 5-6</b>	Using a recipe you want to try out with mom or dad, find words with your speech sound in the instructions and say those phrases or sentences out loud.	Name something with your speech sound for each color of the rainbow (e.g. a X is red, a X is orange, a X is yellow, and so on).	Looking at a map, find 5 states or cities with your speech sound and make up a sentence (e.g. X is near..., X is in the state of..., X is bigger than...).	Think of 3 of your friends whose names have your speech sound and use a phrase or sentence to describe each of them.	Play a memory game using words with your speech sound and make up sentences with the words for each of the pairs found.
<b>Weeks 7-8</b>	Find hidden objects in your room that have your speech sound. As you find them, make up a sentence about each one.	Come up with a tongue twister using words with your speech sound.	Come up with sentences with your speech sound using words from your spelling words list.	Tell how 2 things with your speech sound are the same and how they are different.	Write out a short story about something you enjoy and read it to someone using your speech sound(s) correctly.
<b>Weeks 9-10</b>	Read aloud for 5-10 minutes focusing on your speech sound(s), self-correcting when necessary.	Read a short storybook and retell the story including characters, setting, problem, and solution using your speech sound(s) correctly.	Do a "show-and-tell" for your parents and siblings of your favorite toy, game, or hobby using your speech sound(s) correctly.	Sing your favorite song using your speech sound(s) correctly.	Tell someone as much as you can about your favorite holiday or time of year using your speech sound(s) correctly.
